Interests in retinal imaging, visual function testing, biomarkers, clinical trial endpoints, natural history studies, and therapeutic development are especially welcome.

The successful candidate will join a collaborative academic research environment developing and evaluating novel approaches to the diagnosis, monitoring, and treatment of retinal disease, working alongside clinical investigators, vision scientists, imaging specialists, electrophysiologists, genetic counselors, study coordinators, and academic, foundation, and industry partners.

- Participate in and help lead clinical trials, investigator-initiated studies, natural history protocols, and translational research in medical retina
- Develop independent or collaborative research initiatives
- Enroll and evaluate patients in clinical studies
- Prepare manuscripts and grant applications
- Present research findings at national and international meetings
- Contribute to the continued growth of the Foundation's clinical trials and retinal disease research programs

- M.D., M.D./Ph.D., or equivalent degree
- Completion of an accredited ophthalmology residency and fellowship in medical retina, vitreoretinal disease, inherited retinal disease, or a closely related subspecialty
- Board certified or board eligible in ophthalmology; eligible for medical licensure in Texas
- Prior experience in clinical trials, retinal imaging, IRD, AMD, or translational research preferred but not required
